

# The First Reading: Zechariah 9:9,10

The prophet foretells the coming of Zion's King to his city in humility and lowliness. He enters "righteous and having salvation." The King's procession is unlike that of any earthly monarch because he brings peace between God and man.

# The Epistle Reading: Philippians 2:5-11

Paul commends the "attitude...of Christ Jesus" to to the Philippians for their imitation. As he does so, the apostle describes the Christ who humbled himself to death on the cross and was exalted to the highest place in the heavens. The Lord Jesus is described in both his humility and his exaltation, in his perfect humanity and his full deity. He is rightly called Lord, and to him all creation must and will bow.

# The Gospel Reading: Mark 11:1-10


