The First Reading: Hosea 5:15-6:6

Jesus' words of condemnation for the Pharisees came from the mouth of Hosea, a prophet long familiar with unfaithful Israel.

The Psalm of the Day: Psalm 119c, page 111 in your Hymnal

Second Reading: Romans 4:18-25

How could God chose the people he did? Because of the alien righteousness credited to all of us who believe in him who raised Jesus from the dead.

The Verse of the Day: Alleluia. God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Alleluia.

The Gospel Reading: Matthew 9:9-13

The call of Matthew makes known the mercy of God. Jesus turned to the sinner, Matthew, and called him from his life of sin to a life of ministry with those merciful words, "Follow Me.

Applying God's Word to our Lives this Week:

Text: Matthew 7:24-27

Theme: God Desires Mercy

- 1. Not by our sacrifice
- 2. By faith in the sacrifice he made for us.

Holy Communion: In Holy Communion we are receiving Jesus' true body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins, new life, and salvation. But that's not all. We also receive strength, encouragement, and comfort knowing that in this sacrament we are at one with our God through Jesus' death on the cross for our sins, we are one in faith with those communing beside us, and we are joined with all the saints, who share our common faith. For this reason we practice close communion, inviting only WELS or ELS members to partake of the sacrament so as not to call into question the communion that we share.
